Paradise Valley Families:

The month of **December** is full of celebrations of all kinds; Hanukkah, Christmas, Kwanzaa or perhaps one unique to your own family or culture. Regardless, a common theme that brings us all together is the act of giving. We can give in a material nature, and we can give in ways that cost no money at all. By taking an extra few minutes to hear how your child's day went, or by reading an extra book at night, or perhaps by simply sharing aloud what you treasure in them...you bestow a gift.

Our Home and School Association continues to bless our school with its abundant generosity. All students will have access to three online learning resources; Brainpop, Accelerated Reader and IXL. The first is an award-winning site that provides online videos that teach specific content. The media is engaging, age appropriate and speaks to our youth in a medium that is second nature to their generation. Accelerated Reader motivates readers by allowing students to take comprehension guizzes on particular books they've read. We will be tracking and sharing classroom participation to encourage excitement. I can't wait to discover which class reads the most books. Finally, IXL invites children to solve math problems of all kinds. The questions are standards-based and provide immediate feedback. The best news of all is that these websites will not only be accessible to your children at school, but also at home, 24/7 (although I would not encourage use after midnight ;-)). We will have the usernames and passwords distributed no later than the first week of December. Thank you Home and School Association. We are grateful for this gift!

From an academic standpoint, we administered our first "progressive" benchmark for grades 2 – 6 in the area of language arts and math during the week of parent conferences. The first assessment administered at the start of the school year was a "mirror." This means it covered a large number of CST assessed standards. Its purpose was to set a baseline and to provide insight for teachers regarding a student's potential prior knowledge. The recent "progressive" measured a smaller number of standards and served as a follow-up on instruction to determine a student's areas of strength and need. The administration went very well! Each assessment was broken into two parts and administered over two days. All second through sixth graders began the assessment at 8 am each day and students who benefited from additional time beyond the 45 minutes allotted finished their tests in the library. The results are in. I will be preparing a letter explaining the results and you will receive an update regarding your child's progress during the second week of December.

Finally, I ask for your support in two areas; traffic and volunteer sign-in. We've all settled into the year (which is great), but we mustn't forget that student safety is paramount. Morning and afternoon traffic are an unfortunate reality, even in Paradise. Our school was built for about 500 students, but we now have 700. No matter how we reroute the traffic, we can't change that there are more cars. Please try to arrive early, find a spot in the neighborhood and walk your child in or out, if you can make such an arrangement. If you cannot, please know that we have student supervision starting at 7:25 am and you're welcome to drop off at that time. When driving through, there is only one lane of traffic. Please do not pull around a car that is stopped to let out or pick up a student. Doing so could risk a student being hit and injured. Please do not park in the drive through (FIRE LANE) at any point! You may not leave your vehicle unattended in this area. Lastly, please ensure that you sign in when you arrive to volunteer. This is an expectation for all parents, even those of you who volunteer on a daily basis. It is critical that we are able to account for all non-staff adults on campus to ensure the safety of Paradise Valley students. I thank you in advance for your graciousness when I kindly ask where your name tag is if it is not visible when I see you. My only goal is to make certain that each and every child under my watch is returned safely to their guardian at the end of each day.

**Enjoy the weeks ahead!** May the season of giving, merriment and wonder sweep you up and rekindle in you a sense of child-like joy to carry you through to the New Year.

#### **Project Cornerstone**

Last month, our volunteer readers went into every classroom to present "Simon's Hook" by Karen Burnett. This book introduced five specific skills that can be used to respond to teasing - 1) Do little or nothing 2) Agree 3) Distract 4) Laugh 5) Stay away or ignore.

This month our readers will read "Say Something!" by Peggy Moss to Grades 1 - 6. The book's message to "say something" is a call to action for all of us to move from the passive role of bystander to the positive, active role of UPstander. This lesson promotes many opportunities bystanders have to safely influence either the target or person with bully behaviors. By moving from a role of passive bystander to active UP-stander, kids feel personal power in their ability to positively contribute to a safe and caring school climate.

The Kindergarten readers will be presenting "**Talk** and Work it Out" by Cheri J. Meiners. In this book, peaceful conflict resolution is simplified so children can learn to calm down, state the problem, listen and think of and try solutions.
