Paradise Valley Families:

At our **September Back to School night**, I spoke with you about "partnership; an arrangement where parties agree to cooperate to advance their mutual interests." I would like to revisit this theme as we continue progressing through the year.

Teachers and students are partnering together in the effort to maximize learning. Students are demonstrating their commitment to their education by coming to school on time, completing their homework with care and attention and giving 100% of their attention in class. Teachers are preparing lessons delivered to whole groups and small groups, as well as touching base individually with students. This partnership is strengthened by the involvement of parents. We are so fortunate to have a parent community that understands the importance of education and that joins in the effort rather than sitting on the sidelines.

In order to ensure that the relationship between each family and their teacher is strong, **please address any concerns directly with your child's classroom teacher before addressing the matter with me**. Our teachers are remarkable professionals and have the singular goal of doing right by your son or daughter. I have every confidence that when we work together to "solve problems" (a very important component of our school pledge), we model for our Paradise Valley youth productive and effective ways of handling conflict. As the school leader, I am always here to support conversations and facilitate solutions and will do so in partnership with our families and education staff.

On the topic of strengthening relationships, we held a very successful **Leadership Summit on January 17th.** One teacher from every grade level and seven parents participated in a full day session at the district office where we engaged in discussion reminding us of the focus of education, the need for systematic implementation practices, information about the upcoming **Common Core Content Standards (CCSS)** and what is possible if we put our minds to it in partnership. We brain stormed an initial list of ways to ensure that community, excellence and innovation remain core to our mission. We will be meeting in February to follow up on next steps and commit to communicating with you all along the way.

One immediate outcome is a series of **parent workshops** that will be held in our library at **6 pm**. A flyer will be going home; but **save these dates**.

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Project Cornerstone

We started the new year off with a wonderful story, *Mr. Peabody's Apples* by Madonna. This update of a 300-year-old story is a vivid reminder of the power of words. It teaches children that we must choose our words carefully every day to avoid causing harm to other people. We are reminded to take the time to understand the truth, to know the whole story, and to be cautious about passing information on to others. As their role models, we must remember that children learn to behave by watching everything we do and say. Show them how to find the truth, avoid passing on half-true information to others, and stop gossip.

In **February**, we will be reading *My* **Secret Bully** by **Trudy Ludwig**. This story deals with **relational bullying**. Relational bullying refers to "acts of emotional bullying hidden among tightly knit networks of friends." Instead of using their fists to hit or feet to kick, relational bullying includes "under the radar" actions like spreading rumors, intimidating and humiliating, excluding and ignoring, as well as manipulating a victim.
