Principal's Message

Dear Paradise Valley Families:

As September comes to a close, I'd like to extend my gratitude to our community for the support it has shown through the **Back to School BBQ**, the **Book Fair** and a **phenomenal** turn out at **Back to School Night**. At the principal presentation at Back to School Night, you heard me speak of **PARTNERSHIP** and its foundations; trust in each other's best intentions, open listening, respectful communication and a focus on solutions. With these tenets as our guides, I have no doubt that together we will support each and every child in reaching "**Proficient or Beyond!**"

During October and November, our education staff we will be completing the planning phase of our What-I-Need (W-I-N) time initiative. During W-I-N time, students will be regrouped for 30 minutes to receive instruction targeted at a specific need. Our English Learners will receive Systematic ELD instruction, English Only students who have not yet reached proficiency in either language arts or math will receive explicit instruction to support growth in their area of need and students who have already reached the "Proficient or Beyond" target will participate in learning crafted at their level. In the National Implementation Research Network of 2007, Fixsen and Blase note that, "Implementation is the art and science of moving research-based innovations into practice in order to achieve the promised benefits to students, schools, and communities." This process includes three general phases: 1) planning, 2) launching, and 3) sustaining. It is critical that adequate time and thoughtfulness be dedicated to the first phase to ensure ongoing success. We are working diligently to determine optimal grouping while also specifically addressing the instruction that will take place during this block of time. This process is quite complex and it requires out of the box thinking with fluid, creative solutions. We will continue to communicate our progress with you and appreciate your support as we set our students and teachers up for success during W-I-N time.

As educators, our primary goal is to ensure each and every child reaches "Proficient or Beyond!" This requires every moment of instruction to be focused and purposeful. This includes time spent in the **computer**

lab. Therefore, we need to allow sufficient planning to support this endeavor. As previously mentioned, the research on implementation is overwhelming. By cutting the planning phase short, a new initiative can suffer dire consequences. Our education staff is committed to maximizing the parent investment of our computer lab and we will continue making strides in reinforcing standards-based learning with technology. We ask for your patience as we work through these intricacies toward sustained incorporation of technology into our culture of teaching and learning.

In October, thanks to the planning efforts of our parent community, **Project Cornerstone** will launch at Paradise Valley. Each class will have an **ABC Reader** that reads a book emphasizing one or more developmental assets. These assets are values that have been identified as ones that support students in relationship and life, so they may thrive. We look forward to the common language that will result as we all participate in this valuable program.

Finally, on the operational front, I look forward to working with our education staff and parent community in the coming month to plan the active participation of volunteers during recess and lunch. We have approximately 350 students out on the play yard at any given time and we need to work together to provide our children with a safe space to get their wiggles out. It is critical that this effort be a collaboration and that we dedicate adequate time to the specifics. A first step is to clarify our play ground rules and communicate them effectively to our students. Then we must define the role of student or parent "fun-visors" and delineate how to encourage positive behavior while also outlining who is responsible for addressing behavior that is not aligned with the play ground rules. Upon launching this initiative, we will carefully monitor any challenges that arise and make adjustments as needed. All along the way, we commit to keeping you informed and involved in the process.

Thank you for your partnership as we walk arm-in-arm in support of Paradise Valley students.

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
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
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
