5. Principal's Report - Swati Dagar

Chef Beach took over as director of Student nutrition last year. Swati attended a sampling las year, and now she wants to share him with the parents. His vision for the future; its been long road to get to where we are now. The goal is to provide healthy, nutritious, quality, safety and sanitation of all kitchens. Get clean product, healthy labels, these facilities are not meant to produce this product, but with the new kitchen we are trying to fix that. Fresh meat, locally scoured produce. Training staff for scratch cooking now, as most of the staff is only trained to reheat. Right now there are 50 recipes they are working on. The goal is to convert the pre packaged lunches to an actual lunch room. PVEA and Britton will be getting a new kitchens, these kitchens will be larger, and they will be able to cook on site. The department of student nutrition is a self sufficient department, and he would like parent involvement, and to increase participation. They have begun to introduce breakfast program, instead of brunch. He agreed that there needs to be better marketing of the breakfast program. Hi goal is getting rid of full packaged products, having real pancakes, waffles, and french toast. Parents brought up that a lot of the kids miss brunch. A parent asked if the gluten free, and dairy free students be taken care of? A gluten free menu has been created, but the district doesn't have the resources to take this on yet, but they are working on it. Parents asked if is it possible to do site by site, brunch vs breakfast. Concerns about having food in the classroom. with rodents, and mess, and distraction. morgen brought up the Japanese model of food in the school as an option. they can put notes in the system about food allergies and things parents don't want them to have. The idea of reverse lunch, where the kids play first then eat was brought up. Chef Beach has made a deal with USDA for special pilot program, local sourced meat, and produce. This program is starting at the high schools and working its way down. Chef Beach really wants the breakfast program to be successful. Our school doesn't meet the requirements for open food, like a traditional lunch line. All food staff needs to have serve safe certification, and food handlers card is now required, it hadn't been required in

the past. Lots of things in the background that needed to be fixed before. Right now they are working off of last years menus. New recipes will be coming in October, November, December. 5-10 new recipes.
