Dear Paradise Valley Family,

Reenergized from all the great times with friends and family, fantastic food, and a wonderful holiday, the staff at Paradise Valley is off to a fantastic start of a busy new year ahead! We hope you had a relaxing time with family and experienced some warm memories with your children. I want to take this opportunity to thank you for the wonderful New Year wishes and gifts.

We have a new school banner that has been put up on the driveway entrance fence for all our school community to cherish and our Paradise Panthers to feel the school spirit as they enter the school premises. The whole community will continue to cheer for our Paradise Panthers as they "Watch Us Roar!"

With so many new families enrolled here at Paradise Valley since December, I want to take a moment to review the student drop off and pick up procedures in our parking lot. In the morning, as you enter our parking lot, stay in the curb lane and fill in any gaps in front of you. Wait in the line of cars and continue to move forward until you have reached the loading zone (front of school building) and have filled the gap. Please have your child ready to get out before you reach the loading zone. We recommend keeping the backpacks and lunch boxes in the car next to your child. Please do not stop your car and drop off your child on the street adjoining the Kindergarten playground. This creates a backup of cars behind you. Once you have dropped your child off, you may drive forward in the loading zone lane. Please do not drive in the adjoining lane and race to an open space in the student loading zone cutting in front of other cars. I have witnessed many near misses between one car racing to cut into an open space and the other car moving forward to fill that gap. When picking your child up after school, we ask that you follow the same procedures. Get in line and fill the gaps, wait until you have reached the student loading zone (front of school). Once you have reached the loading zone and have moved as far forward as possible, your child will come and get into the car. Please, do not drive in the adjoining lane and signal for your child to come out between parked cars to meet you. We have school personnel that will guide you to move forward, slow, or stop to ensure safe student pick-up. Finally, parents who are walking their children to the school or to the cars, please have your children walk with you. Do not allow them to run ahead of you or straggle behind. We want to make sure all our students are safe at all times at school and we request your support and cooperation to ensure safe student drop-off and pick up.

I am a firm believer in the power of positivity and appreciation to bring out the best in people. At Paradise Valley, we will be starting Student of the Month Assemblies to appreciate two students from each class at every grade level who will get Student of the Month recognition. The criteria for this award is not just academics but citizenship, hard work and efforts made by the student, leadership demonstrated, and being a proud Paradise Panther!

In closing, on behalf of all of us Paradise Panthers, I echo three words, "Watch Us Roar!"

Things Can Change in Third Grade!

Whether it is the entire grade level embracing the new Common Core standards or kids transitioning to daily homework instead of weekly packets, third grade at Paradise Valley is about some important changes. Additionally, it means a larger emphasis on responsibility for one's learning, specifics like already knowing addition and subtraction facts when entering third grade, learning multiplication facts during the year, getting "outside the box" a bit more, and becoming independent thinkers. Mrs. Carney characterizes this great age and grade as the "Goldilocks" stage, "Not too small, not too grown up ... they are just right!"



The third grade staff is:

- Mrs. Doting teaching for 14 years with three years full-time at Paradise Valley, also a past Paradise Valley parent with all three of her daughters having attended PV,
- Mrs. Mason teaching for nine years with seven of them at Paradise Valley,
- Mrs. Bonino teaching for 18 years with the past three at Paradise Valley,
- Mrs. Carney the newest member of the third grade team, has been teaching for 20 years with the past two at Paradise Valley,
- Mrs. Rebollar teaching for 20 years, seven in this district, and has taught students with special needs in grades 1-4 for the past three years at Paradise Valley.

Each teacher cites the right reasons for becoming a teacher, including wanting to be a positive role model, enjoying the variety and flexibility that working with kids affords, and making a positive difference for others.

However, each brings a varied professional and/or personal interest that can only enhance students' experiences. For example, Mrs. Doting worked as a clinical pediatric dietitian prior to teaching and would like to add nutrition and healthy habits as a regular classroom topic. Mrs. Rebollar worked in a hospital's newborn intensive care unit before earning a teaching credential, but would also consider working in a library or as a gardener. In fact, her class has been doing a lot of planting, and is currently watching the Narcissus bloom. Mrs. Carney has a particular interest in California history, the westward movement, and the settling of California. She may even consider joining that interest with the dream to own an historic location and turn it into a Tea House, where she could welcome people, serve tea and dainties, and teach guests about California from 150 years ago.

Mrs. Mason and Mrs. Bonino both point to the third grade team's plans for incorporating computer skills, including typing, to help students succeed in the Common Core lessons, which are lots of innovative lessons for critical thinking throughout the curriculum. What makes Common Core different from past teaching practices includes a focus on fewer standards, requiring deeper understanding, a greater emphasis on problem solving and collaboration, and better continuity as students' progress from grade to grade.

New standards or old, third grade sounds fun and challenging, thanks to Paradise Valley's skilled staff. Our children are in good hands and getting well prepared for fourth grade!
