The four-person team is in a harmonious lock-step not only in its preparations for common core standards, but also in its commitment to helping students achieve and grow within the rigorous second grade standards.

The team is made up of Rachel Marquardt, Megan Telfer, Stephanie Majors, and Alice Packard. Mrs. Marquardt and Mrs. Telfer are teaching partners who split the week between them.

They are working diligently to weave together a great new common core oriented curriculum into what they already are doing so well. That includes consistent computer lab time to practice typing and tech skills that will help them in assessments next year. But don't think that computer skills instruction is overshadowing time spent on reading workshops, math, and science, which are still fundamental components of each classroom. Here is a snapshot of each:

**Mrs. Marquardt** has taught for five years total, with two here at Paradise. She has also taught fourth grade and appreciates the value of knowing what kids need to be prepared for down the road. Math and science are favorite subjects because math forces kids to understand that there is one right answer to find, while science invites many unanswered questions and lots of hands on activities. She would love to make time for health, nutrition, and fitness instruction because it is so important to start early with exercise and eating right. Funniest situation Mrs. Marquardt has encountered? She sums up with if it happens at home, we teachers know about it! Kids can be the most honest and sharing people to work with! Good to know ...

**Mrs. Telfer** has taught for seven years, all at Paradise, with six of those years in second grade and one year teaching first. Her heart is in second grade without a doubt! Like Mrs Marquardt, math is a favorite subject and she would also like to make time for nutrition instruction. She took a nutrition class in college and it changed her life. Imagine if that could happen in elementary school! Congratulations to her and her husband are preparing for another baby girl in June. Mrs. Telfer is especially grateful for her teaching partner, Rachel Marquardt, who is also a great friend. By team teaching, they get the best of both worlds: mom to our little ones at home and teacher to our wonderful students.

**Mrs. Packard** has been teaching for 11 years, with nine years spent at El Toro elementary. She has taught first and fifth grade, but for her there is no other grade – second grade rules! Her favorite subject is teaching Reader's Workshop. Her students start the day off with a great book that ties in with the current subject.
