I would like to revisit the recess lining up procedure for our students. Over the past year or so, all $1^{\text{st}} - 3^{\text{rd}}$ graders out at recess were asked to freeze and take a knee when the bell rang. Students were then asked to walk to their classroom line when the yard supervisors blew a whistle. Students in grades $4^{\text{th}} - 6^{\text{th}}$ simply walked to the line when the bell rang. With the overarching goal of being consistent and reinforcing uniform school practice, we are moving towards having all students (K- 6^{th} grade) simply freeze when they hear the bell (not take a knee) and then walk to their classroom line when the yard supervisors blow the whistle.

I had my first Principal-Parent Coffee on September 17th and met with a few parents. I would like to invite many more of you to join me as we enjoy a cup of coffee together and chat about our school. The Principal- Parent Coffee is one of the ways that I would like to encourage parents to provide us with feedback. Like I said before, the more we communicate and share information, the more successful our school will be!

The "One Yard" Youth Development Program

Welcome to our newest program at Paradise Valley! "One Yard" is an on-site coach-guided positive play, game, and activity program designed to welcome and teach interested students about standard favorite games and new activities they can become a part of during recesses, lunch breaks, and even before school. The primary focus of the program is to provide students with positive play opportunities and conflict resolution skills. As a part of the program, 5th and 6th grade teachers nominate about 30 students who will be "Junior Coaches" to help assist as student leaders and help their peers/ younger grade level students with conflict resolution as and when needed. These Junior Coaches will be provided training in conflict resolution and positive play strategies to help out during recess play time. Besides the recess positive play time, all students will have class game time when they will be pulled every other week for 'game time' with the Coach on site. This new, positive play youth development program is an excellent complement to the arts and game themed "Funvisor" program during lunch breaks.

It may be surprising, but conflicts during recesses and lunch are sometimes carried over into the classroom and can disrupt the rest of the day. A program like "One Yard" helps minimize conflicts through coach-guided/ student leader resolution in the moment and reinforces common language and resolution tools introduced in other programs, like Project Cornerstone.

We are looking at starting the program the first week of October. Coach Rance Hodge will be on campus to roll out the program. It is co-funded by the Home and School Association and Paradise Valley

Welcome to First Grade!



First grade can be a bit scary for some little ones. Maybe nerveracking for parents too? No longer in the somewhat insulated comfort of the kindergarten pod, the kids have graduated to the "big kid" playground, classrooms, sharing lunch and recess with multiple grade levels, and weekly homework. But not to worry!

Paradise Valley's four 1^{st} grade teachers have the right mix of experience and energy to help smooth the transition and get our children prepared for every year to follow.

Thank you in advance to our first grade staff: Mrs. Scampini, Room 13; Mrs. Fox, Room 14; Mrs. Balestrieri, Room 15; and, Mrs. Buckner, Room 22.

When talking with any one of the teachers, it is easy to see that each has a strong sense of commitment to and excitement about teaching in general, and first grade especially. For example, Mrs. Balestrieri sums up the shared sentiment with: "No other grade is quite like it. I find six year olds to be outspoken, imaginative and genuine. Best of all, they are still readily able to enter the world of make believe and perceive magic as coexisting in their world. Who better to spend your time with?" Mrs. Scampini also cites the variety from one day to the next as a significant component of her love for teaching. Not many jobs can offer that.

Why is first grade so important? It is the grade when young kids understand that there are expectations to meet and behaviors that are required when working in any type of group setting. While kinder students are learning about those things for the first time and maybe given an extra chance or two, it is in first grade that kids get the chance to be more independent, responsible and accountable. All of that may seem daunting to a little kid, but Mrs. Buckner knows that in addition to teaching academics, the person leading the classroom must also exemplify patience, understanding, and a loving, encouraging spirit. Without those attributes, a teacher will fall flat, and all of the students will too.

With approximately 40 years of combined expertise, our first grade staff has a wide range of teaching history that lends itself to a richer experience for their students. Mrs. Fox transferred her preschool know-how to a lively, challenging classroom environment for the past five years at Paradise. And Mrs. Scampini's previous years teaching in grades two through four give her an insight into what extras will make the right impact for kids' success as they move up.

Each teacher has strengths and personal interests that shine through and will, undoubtedly, influence their students. Mrs. Balestrieri's has a passion for the arts, Mrs. Fox loves marine biology, and Mrs. Buckner enjoys teaching science and social studies lessons. No matter what those interests may be, Paradise Valley's first graders are in good hands and already well on their way!
